

Sunday 14 April 2024 – Third Sunday of Easter

In the Gospel passage for this Sunday Jesus appears to his disciples, and we are told that they were startled and terrified, as they thought they were seeing a ghost. Even if Jesus was a ghost, I am left to ponder why they would be afraid of seeing the ghost of their trusted leader and caring friend. Were they genuinely concerned to see Jesus again, or were they merely consumed by fear that too often comes with the unknown. Life



for many is full of unknowns and the future of the Church is no different. Communities of faith in our society have been in gradual decline for decades and, when we come face to face with that reality, we too can be overwhelmed by a multitude of emotions. As Jesus' disciples experienced this time of transition, they felt everything was lost, but what felt like the end, was actually the beginning of a new and exciting phase for the people of God. This weekend as a Parish we will be releasing a survey to further the conversation about how we move forward amid ongoing change for both our society and the church. It means facing the unknown, but doing so with confidence that God journeys with us. As a church community there will be familiar things we need to relinguish and new things we need to embrace. This survey is motivated by the reality that we are facing a significant deficit in our operating budget for this year. The projected expenditure for the Parish for the year is over \$200,000, that includes costs incurred employing a full time Rector, part time Administrator, ongoing cost related to the running of St Clement's site and activities, as well as nominal external giving. Unless giving significantly increases or alternate income is found, the Parish will end up coming face to face with a \$60,000 shortfall at the end year which will come out of our minimal reserves. If we keep going the way we are now, the Parish will not have the funds to operate throughout 2025. As we face that reality, I expect we all feel somewhat startled and terrified. It is a hard truth, but we must remember the Good News of the Gospel, we must remember that our God does not leave us alone. Having conversations about change opens the door for new and transformative opportunities. I invite you to approach this process with excitement rather than dread. Also, please join us in prayer, praying for both God's wisdom and blessing as we continue striving to be the people God has called us to be here at St Clement's on the Hill. God Bless, Rev Steven.




Pot Luck Dinner Friday 26 April 6.30pm-8.00pm

Here at St Clement's the sacrament of Holy Communion, along with the Word of God, is central to our worship and an invitation to receive Holy Communion is extended to all who attend.

- *Gluten Free If you require a gluten-free wafer at communion, please simply ask the priest during communion.*
- Blessing If you wish to receive a blessing rather than communion, please indicate by keeping your hands by your side.
- Health and Safety If you have had a cold/virus over the past week we ask that you receive Holy Communion in one kind; that is the bread and not the wine. Taking the chalice is optional. Please note that intinction (dipping the bread) is not permitted as it is a health risk; it also introduces gluten to the wine, which is a further health risk to those who have a gluten allergy.
