FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT - YEAR B

A reading from Jeremiah 31:31-34

³¹The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. ³³But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the Lord', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

²⁰Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' ²²Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour. ²⁷Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' ²⁹The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' ³⁰Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. ³¹Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' ³³He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

Parish Council Report

Parish Council met on 13 March. After opening with a prayer and an acknowledgement of country, Councillors reflected on the question, *"Which Holy Week/Easter service holds the most significance for you and why?"* All services were mentioned with three Councillors opting to mention more than one significant service.

Father Steven reported on the Lenten Study groups, noting there were 18 participants. He provided a schedule of Parish and Diocesan services in the lead up to Easter. He foreshadowed his attendance at a conference on Sunday 26 May.

The Executive tabled a summary of their second meeting. A giving and attendance comparison tabled at that meeting was shared with Parish Council. The comparative data from 2016 to 2023 indicate parishioners have increased their giving, disproportionately as numbers attending church have fallen through COVID and beyond, from \$14.19 to \$30.57 on average. A "Flourishing Future" survey developed by the executive to engage parishioners in ownership of the strategies we will implement to ensure vibrant sustainability was endorsed by Parish Council. It will be introduced and distributed soon after Easter.

Treasurer, Agnes Elkenhans, presented the financial statements for February which again display a small deficit.

Activities of Mission Action Teams were reported and the Fundraising Calendar for 2024 was endorsed. Gratitude was expressed for the Produce Stall, a weekly fundraiser, for the service it provides as well as the contribution Susanne and other volunteers make to our bottom line. General Business included,

- A proposed Hymn Festival later in the year.
- A meeting with the Ithaca-Ashgrove Thrift Shop to discuss possible shared operations.
- Diocesan Discussion Paper on the Meaning of Elector. Copies available on the table.
- Working Bees will be held on consecutive Saturdays to prepare for Palm and Easter Sundays.
- Decision to purchase a new ride-on -mower.
